## **Update on Smoke & Vape Shop Legislation**

Last month I wrote to our University District community about their concerns regarding the smoke and vape shops in our community, specifically in regards to the smoke & vape shop located at 3168 Main Street.

I wanted to provide an update and let you all know that after the initial filing of this legislation that is aimed to give you and our communities the opportunity for feedback before approval from the City of Buffalo/Common Council, the legislation needed to be altered to increase the fines for those who disobey the new legislation.

For prior context: unfortunately, at this time, smoke & vape shop licensing and regulations are controlled by New York State. This legislation will change that.

A change is coming very soon, please be patient and I appreciate the community members who have stood up and let their voices be heard!

### This Past Month in the District





Last month, we held a community town hall to get public feedback on the future of the Bailey-Dartmouth Community Garden. It was amazing to see so many community members from across our district come together to share their feedback and ideas on the future of this beloved garden in memory of Shaquanna Terice Jackson. Thank you all for your valuable input and let's continue to work towards creating a thriving and sustainable community for generations to come.

**Next Steps:** The landscape architect firm will take this feedback to develop a plan for the garden with my office, the city, and our community stakeholders, along with the family of Shaquanna Terice Jackson, and then move forward with construction set to begin this summer!

Last month, I once again teamed up with Lovejoy District Council Member Bryan Bollman collaborating with our community food store owners, City of Buffalo Permits & Inspections Office, our E-District Buffalo Police, and the University community for our annual Food Store Licensing Renewal meetings where this is an open forum to listen to the feedback from our residents when it comes to the stores in our districts.

Year after year, we hold these meetings between our community and the store owners to ensure that we're all working together towards a common goal! I want to extend a sincere thank you to the community for their valuable input during our food store renewal licensing meetings!
