#### PARTNER SPOTLIGHT—GERARD PLACE

I recently had the pleasure of speaking with David Zapfel, President & CEO of Gerard Place and one of Buffalo Promise Neighborhood's key partners.

For those of you that are unfamiliar with Gerard Place, their mission is to provide safety and skill building for homeless single parent families seeking secure permanent housing and family wellness. To date over 250 families have come through their doors. With an over 90% success rate, the Gerard Place housing program continues to serve our most vulnerable community members.

Signature programs and services provided by Gerard Place Community Education include TASC (former GED), literacy, computer classes, job readiness training, health and nutrition classes and so much more! Gerard Place partners with over 30 community organizations to implement a full year-round life skills program to those most in need.

In conjunction with the Feedmore WNY the first Thursday of every month a mobile food pantry arrives on-site proving fresh fruits and vegetables to those in need. In addition, every Monday and Wednesday they host a family style dinner that is open to the public. Stop in and enjoy a healthy, hot meal with members of the community and get to know the friendly, knowledgeable Gerard Place staff.

The vision of Gerard Place is to create opportunities, strengthen families and the community all the while working collaboratively with their partners to provide hope, transform lives and break the cycle of generational poverty.

Buffalo Promise Neighborhood is proud to work with Gerard Place in partnership with our Early Learning Center located on their campus. Opened in January of 2019, the center serves approximately 100 children ages 6 weeks to 5 years. Parents who reside at Gerard Place have access to an extensive variety of programs and services though the Buffalo Promise Neighborhood Parent Achievement Zone (PAZ).

When asked to share his proudest career accomplishment Dave Zapfel said that it was raising the funds to create their new Community Center allowing hundreds of people with the opportunity to move their whole family out of poverty.
